Subjects

At the top end there were A* grades in Art (2), English Literature (4), Further Maths (1), Maths (2). Photography (2), RS (2) and Sociology (1). There were also 6 A grades in Art, 4 in English Literature, 3 in each of Maths, History and RS and 2 in each of Chemistry, Economics, Geography and Sociology.

Big successes at A*-C were French, German and Spanish (100%), Art (92%), Government and Politics (88%), Sociology (81%), Chemistry (80%), English Literature (80%), Law (80%), Geography (77%), RS (76%), English Language (73%) and History (72%)

Headline Figures

97.2% of all grades E+

There were 106 students in this exam cohort.

67.1% of all grades C+

44.3% of all grades B+

Summary of results:

These are a very fine set of results and they bear testimony to the very hard work of students and staff over the course of 2 two years. AS Results:

There is much work ahead in Year 13 but students and staff are pleased with this set of results too.
