Subjects

Alongside A* grades in Art, English Literature, History, Maths and Photography there were: 6 A grades in Religious Studies, 5 in Maths, 4 in Sociology and 3 in Geography, English Literature and Psychology. There were 100% A*-B Grades in Further Maths.

Big successes at A*-C were English Language (89%), Geography (77%), German (100%), Government and Politics (100%), Photography (100%), Psychology (75%), Religious Studies (80%) and Sociology (100%). Other subjects also came out well: Computing (67%), Food Technology (67%), English Literature (74%), History (71%), Maths (62%) and Spanish (67%).

Headline Figures

96% of all grades at E+

66% of all grades at C+

40% of all grades at B+

There were 94 students in this year group.

Average points per subject entry: 81 (*UCAS*)

Average points per student: not yet known (*UCAS*)

Headteacher's summary: Not all of this year group started with a strong academic track record.
