**Subjects:** 79% of pupils achieved Grades A\*-C in English and 74% in Maths. 77% gained A\*-C in two Sciences and 56% in at least one Foreign Language. 100% attained C+ in Biology, Chemistry and Physics; in Additional Science it was 89%, in Art 83%, in Food Technology 82%, Drama 81%, English Literature 76% (of all pupils), PE 76%, Music 75%, Geography 74% and German 72%. In Religious Studies 78% reached a C+ at GCSE.

**Headline Figures:** 80% of pupils gained 5 grades at C+. 65% gained 5 grades at C+ including English and Maths. 40% achieved the English Baccalaureate of C+ in all of English, Maths, 2 Sciences, a Modern Foreign Language and either History or Geography. Based on 2015 national figures Progress 8 would be +0.45, nearly half a grade higher than expected.

**Headteacher's summary:** This was a very pleasing set of results, also showing marked progress for these pupils since they entered the school in Year 7. We were particularly thrilled with the continuing high E-Bacc score and the great success in Science and improvements in MFL this represents. Once again English was very high and Maths also well above the national average. A 6% drop in the headline 5A\*-C including English and Maths may follow from what happened in those subjects nationally, but other figures better reflect the consistently strong performance across all subjects, rewarding the many pupils who worked so hard and gained such good individual results. They have done very well.
